The U.S. Constitution

The main rules of the United States are written in the Constitution. It was written about 200 years ago. George Washington and several other men decided what it would say.

The Constitution says that the U.S. government should have three branches. The people who work in one part make laws. The people in the second part make sure the laws are followed. The people in the third part tell what the laws mean.

The Constitution gives people rights. A person has the right to go to the church he wants. He has the right to choose what he writes. He has the right to be treated fairly.

The Constitution is important to everyone in the United States!
