

The Life Cycle of Frogs

First frogs lay their eggs in the water. The jelly keeps the eggs safe and gives them food.

Next the tadpoles come out of the eggs and start swimming and growing bigger and bigger. They don't have any legs. They have a tail to help them swim.

After that the back legs start growing very long. **Then** the front legs start growing.
