Based on the true story of an Indian girl who was kidnapped at birth with the intent of it becoming the next guru, *Island of the Blue Delight* is an exciting story of survival. When Karuna and her brother Kishan are kidnapped from the village, they are a tiny totting on the banks of the Ganges. "One day we thought about running. The courage of the little boy carried us back with him." Playing as the two escape in the wild northern hills, Kishan wants to be a part of the Hindu religion but many people attempt to turn the infant's faith away from his heart and his soul from his body. As a result of the harshness of the men from the village who are Hindus, and the others that visit the area, Kishan says the moment he was born, he died twice. The child who is separated from his natural brother is separated. There are no birds, and the natural elements disappear. The air is corrupting every moment, because it causes the mind to become an animal's mind. Karuna follows a guru Hindu master in a city and is progressively taken by the master like one a slave. She fails to remember past and present life stages. But the day comes for the guru and Karuna realize that her brother is still alive. They jump from the sacred mountain to the village. Because the village is controlled by a guru named Guruji, Karuna's brother is killed by a group of local boys and Karuna is left alone on the island.
