FOREIGN LANGUAGE 3 HR	Proficiency through 115 level: CHIN, GK, LATN, FREN, GR, ITAL, RUSS, SPAN. The foreign language requirement may also be satisfied by a minimum of one semester's study in a foreign country at a College/University where a language other than English is employed in courses taken. Appropriate academic credit will be accepted in transfer. (SLU Language Lab placement tests do not satisfy the foreign language requirement.)

SCIENCES 8 HR	8 HOURS: In a single science , BIOL, CHEM, EAS, or PHYS, outside the department offering the B.S. degree.
MATHEMATICS	4-7 HOURS: Through Calculus I (MATH-142) or higher level.
WORLD HISTORY 6 HR	HIST-111: Origins of the Modern World to 1500 and HIST-112: Origins of the Modern World 1500 to Present.
PHILOSOPHY 6 HR	Two course sequence including , PHIL-205: Ethics. Students may take PHIL $105\ \mathrm{or}$ an upper division philosophy as their second course .
THEOLOGY 6 HR	Two course sequence: THEO-100: Theological Foundations and a 200-level course.
SOCIAL SCIENCE 6 HR	Two 3-hr courses from: ASTD 322: The Urban Crisis, Communication (CMM-100, -200, -280 ONLY**), Communication Sciences & Disorders (CSDI-100 or 470 ONLY), Economics, Education (EDF-424, EDI-462, and EDSP-431 ONLY), Political Science, Psychology, Sociology/Criminal Justice, Social Service (SWRK-100, -227, -302, -327 ONLY) or Public Policy Studies-except for field service. SOC-221, 260, 261 and 262 cannot satisfy both the social science and a natural science requirement of the core curriculum.
