1.1 Play Initiation

Almost Always- the student consistently displays this skill in many settings and with a variety of people.

Often- the student displays this skill on a less consistent basis, settings and with a few people.

Sometimes- the student seldom displays this skill but may demonstrate it on infrequent occasions.

Almost Never- the student never or rarely exhibits this skill. It is unusual to see this in their daily routine.

1.1 Beginning Play Behaviors				
1. Maintains proximity to peers within 1 foot				
2. Offers toy to playmate directly or about 1 foot				
3. Plays with play mate peers using the same or similar materials (e.g., playing cars with a peer who is also playing cars).				
4. Physically initiates play				
5. Verbally initiates play				
6. Takes turns appropriately during simple games				
1.2 Intermediate Play Behaviors				
1. Shares toys and takes turns with activity with peers, even though the assignments of the other children is different.				
2. Physically and verbally responds to interactions from peers (e.g., to a peer peer, answers questions)				
3. Initiates and initiates play with peers				
4. Shows appropriate signs of joining in an activity with peers				
5. Invites others to play				
6. Takes turns during a more complex activity				
7. Allows game rules				
8. Recycles toys, food, and materials from peers				
1.3 Advanced Play Behaviors				
1. Plays cooperatively with peers during imaginative play				
2. Makes comments about what he/she is playing/he/she is				
3. Organizes play (suggests ideas to peers or how to play)				
4. Initiates peer play games				
5. Takes turns during unstructured activities without a clear goal				
6. Adapts toys, food, and materials to peers
