Finding a job requires planning. Once you decide the type of work you would like to do, how will you get the job? There are many people and agencies to help you. One such agency is the school placement bureau. The bureau is usually in touch with the personnel directors of many firms, both large and small. Public and private employment agencies also have contacts with personnel directors. These agencies can tell you of current openings and may even do the actual hiring.
