

PASSIVE VERBS

(Remember: *verb + object* → *subject + auxiliary + English verb*)

Active	Structure	Example
Present Simple	Subject + verb(s) + verb(s) and part	Family is always smiling at you.
Past Simple	Subject + was + verb(s) and part	My wife was worried for her job.
Present Simple (passive)	Subject + verb(s) + am/are + verb(s)	The office has no air-conditioning.
Present Simple (passive form)	Subject + verb(s) + am/are + being + verb(s) and part	Students are going to be their project work.
Present Continuous (passive)	Subject + verb(s) + being + verb(s) and part	They're being chosen for the project.
Past Continuous (passive)	Subject + verb(s) + being + verb(s) and part	My house was being painted when you left.
Future (passive)	Subject + verb(s) + be going to + verb(s)	There will be a meeting to help you learn.
Future (passive form)	Subject + verb(s) + be + going to + verb(s) and part	Students will be recruited from the world.
Passive (present)	Subject + be + verb(s) + verb(s) and part	The book has already been read before this time.
Passive (past)	Subject + verb(s) + been + verb(s) and part verb(s) + verb(s) + verb(s) and part	The house will have been built before you go.
Passive (present continuous)	Subject + verb(s) + being + verb(s) and part	The team is being invited to go to the Olympics.
Passive (past continuous)	Subject + verb(s) + been + verb(s) and part verb(s) + verb(s) + verb(s) and part	The book had been being read for the first time when they started.
Passive (future)	Subject + verb(s) + be + verb(s) and part	The system will have been using people for a long time by that time.
Passive (future continuous)	Subject + verb(s) + be + verb(s) and part verb(s) + verb(s) + verb(s) and part	The system will have been using people for a long time by that time.
