

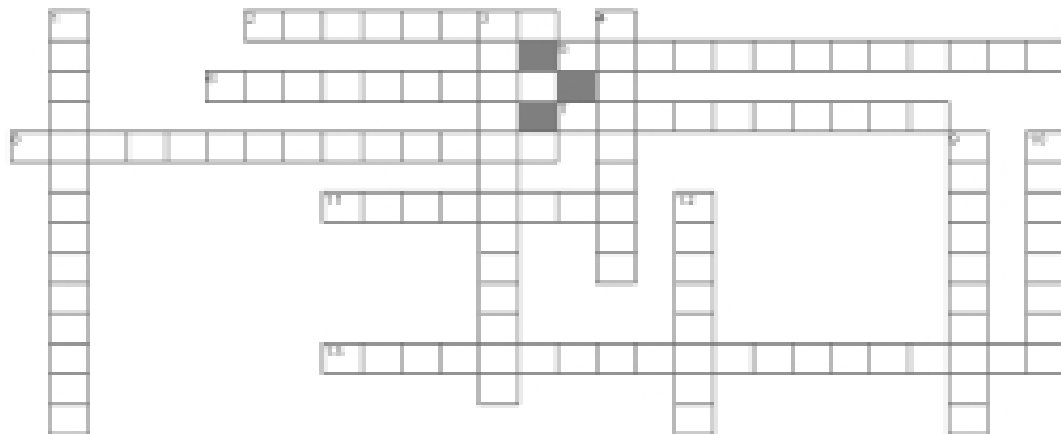
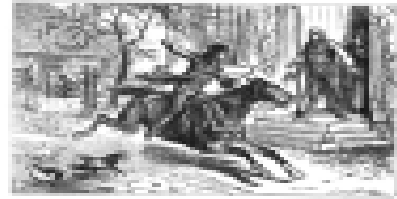

ACROSS

- Colonists who fought against British rule
- Secret group of colonists founded to protest Stamp Act
- Colonists who could be ready in a minute to fight the British
- Rode on horseback from Boston to Lexington and Concord to warn that the Redcoats were coming
- Boston citizens disguised as Indians raided three British ships and dumped chests of tea into the harbor as a protest against taxes on tea
- Nickname for British soldiers because of their red uniform coats
- The legislative assembly composed of delegates from the rebel colonies who met during and after the American Revolution

- The killing of five men by British soldiers on March 5, 1770
- Provisional peace treaty signed after Lord Cornwallis surrendered at Yorktown
- Colonists who remained loyal to the King during the American Revolution
- The government of Great Britain, includes the king, the House of Commons, the House of Lords and the prime minister
- Civilian soldiers who are trained to fight but not part of the regular army
