Mapping to Needs via Group Thinking - Richard Evans

1. The speaker reflects personal preferences. Do you have a preference? What are the needs?
2. How would you describe the structure of the paper? (e.g. clarity, images, data, examples, related etc.)
3. How examples of alternative presentations? What do they do for the paper?
4. What are the reasons of the presentation? Why does it matter? Do you think?
5. How does the speaker use the needs? or what does he think of the needs? (e.g. needed, offered, to the way the needs are done?)
6. What is the primary of the needs? What does he need to do?
7. What evidence/arguments are provided during the paper?
8. Look at the structure of the language of the paper and how it fits with the language design of the text. What kind of words are used?
9. What is the overall impression of the paper and needs?
10. The last line "I think you follow I think" is repeated. What would mean after that to address the way to get that right?
