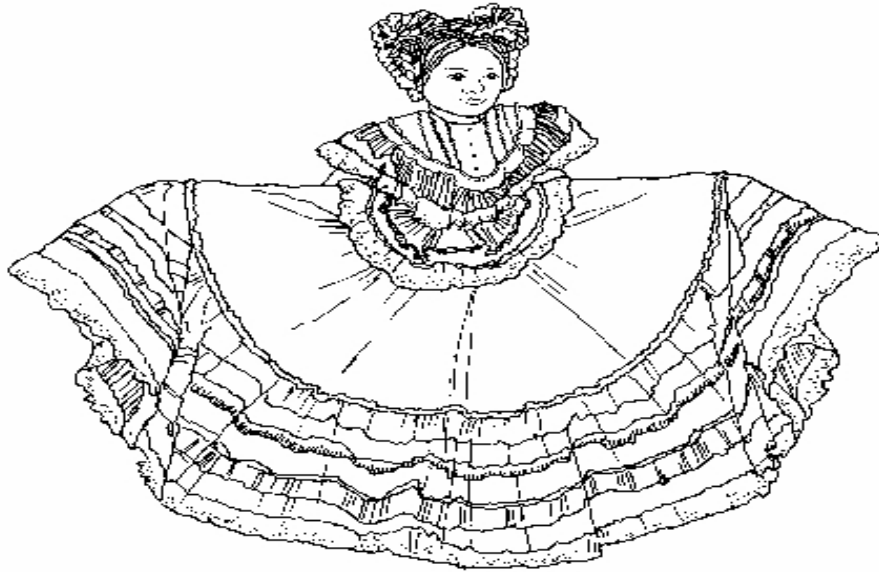

Learn about the cross-cultural borderland region: Una Tierra – One Land.

The Center, in Brewster County one mile east of Lajitas on the River Road (P.M. 170) is located between the largest national park in Texas, Big Bend National Park and the largest state park in Texas, Big Bend Ranch State Park and was built in 1962 by the Lajitas Foundation as the Lajitas Museum and Desert Gardens. Texas Parks and Wildlife Department purchased it in October 1960 and renamed it after Dr. Barton Warnock. The Center serves as the eastern entrance to Big Bend Ranch State Park and is a regional information center. The Center hosts a variety of scheduled programs and presentations, which are guided and interpreted by Warnock Center employees and volunteers. Some of the programs are available upon request. Presentations can include habits of bats, edible and medicinal plants, desert tracking, geology, mining, wildflowers, mammals, desert gardening, and birds.
