

Rhyme Scheme

Rhyme Scheme: Pattern of rhymes in a poem. Rhyme scheme is usually referred to by letters representing the rhyming words (the letters "a" and "b").

I saw a fairy in the wood,^A
He was dressed all in green.^B
He drew his sword while I just stood,^A
And realized I'd been seen.^B
This poem has an ABAB rhyme scheme.

I went to school on Saturday^A
To see what was going on.^B
I saw three kids swimming on the lawn.^B
"Kids?" you say, "On Saturday?"^A
Doesn't that seem wrong?"^B
The kids were goats but now they're gone,^B
And yes you see it's odd in a way...^A
This poem has an ABBABBA rhyme scheme. (ABBA-excellent!)
