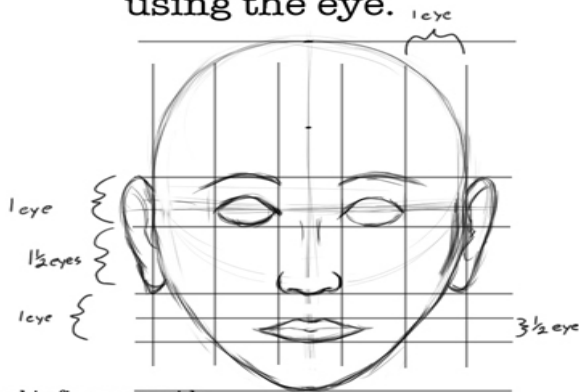
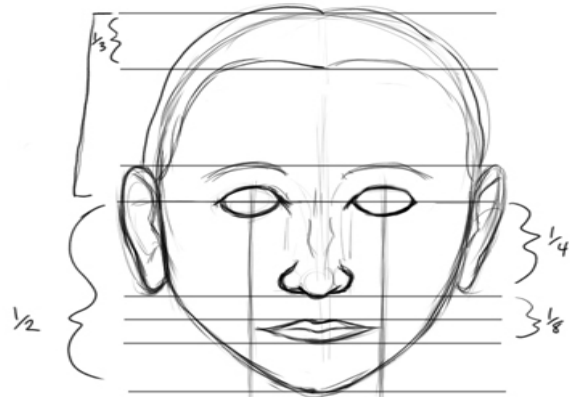


Standard Facial proportions using the eye.



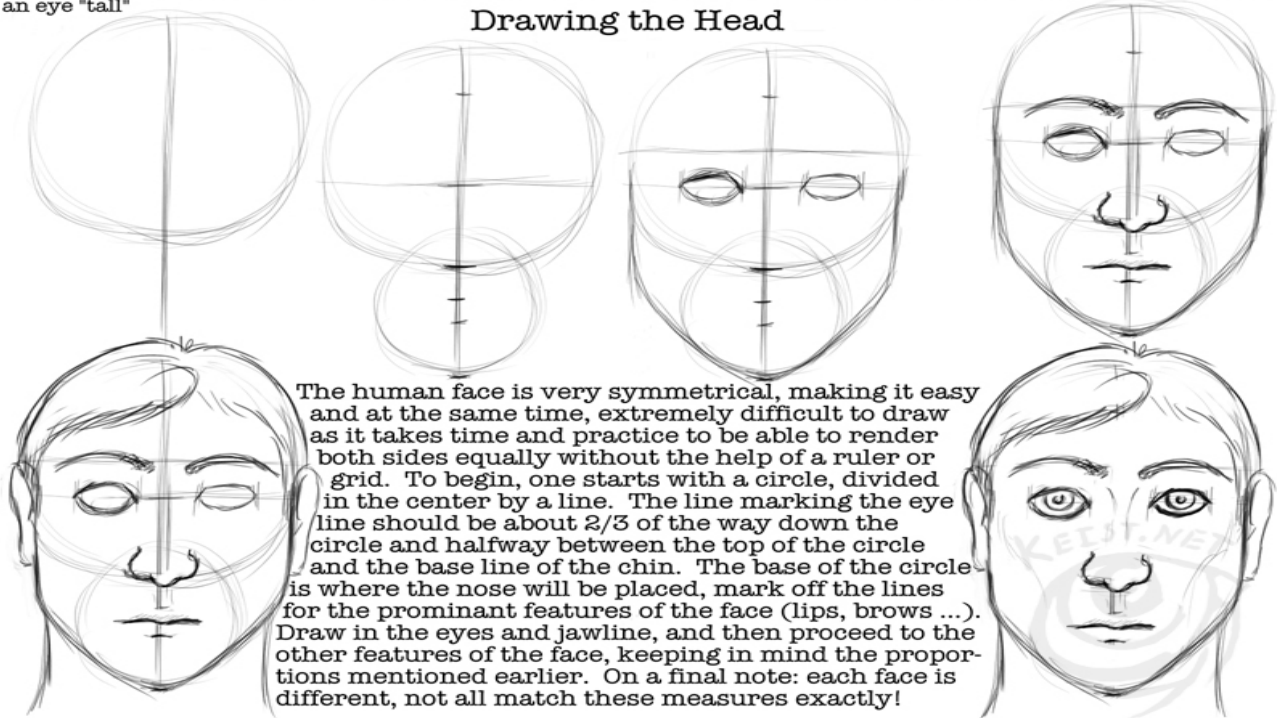
Head is five eyes wide
 Eyes are one eye apart
 Eyes are half as tall as they are wide
 Eyebrows are an eyelength above the eye's base
 Nose tip is about an eye and a half from the center line.
 Nose base is an eye wide
 Base of lips are an eye away from the nose, lips are half an eye "tall"

Basic Facial Layout



The eyes are set in the middle of the head
 The nose ends mid-way between the eyes and chin
 The lower lip ends mid-way between the nose and chin
 The hairline is about 2/3 to the top from the centerline
 The mouth reaches from the center of one eye to the other

Drawing the Head



The human face is very symmetrical, making it easy and at the same time, extremely difficult to draw as it takes time and practice to be able to render both sides equally without the help of a ruler or grid. To begin, one starts with a circle, divided in the center by a line. The line marking the eye line should be about 2/3 of the way down the circle and halfway between the top of the circle and the base line of the chin. The base of the circle is where the nose will be placed, mark off the lines for the prominent features of the face (lips, brows ...). Draw in the eyes and jawline, and then proceed to the other features of the face, keeping in mind the proportions mentioned earlier. On a final note: each face is different, not all match these measures exactly!
