Let's Begin

- Introduce to a farm. What animals are found on the farm?
- Show pictures of different animals that are found on a farm.
- Talk about the different sounds that farm animals make.

Lesson #1: Animal Sounds

How do animals talk to each other?

Animals talk to each other by making sounds.

Can you understand the sounds that other animals make? Duck, cow, pig, and so on.

Why are the chickens and sheep making those sounds? They are trying to tell us that they are hungry. They are also trying to tell us that they are scared.

How do you know they are scared? They are making a noise that sounds like they are crying.

How do you know they are hungry? They are making a noise that sounds like they are growling.

Let's Begin

- What are farm animals covered with?
- Discuss varieties of feathers, wool, hair, and fur.

Lesson #2: Body Cover

All living creatures have a body cover. Some are covered with feathers, some with fur and some with skin.

What farm animals are covered with feathers?

Chickens, turkeys, ducks, and geese. Feathers are used for flying and for insulating the bird's body.

What farm animals have fur?

Cows, horses, and pigs. They have a different type of fur called wool on their bodies. The wool is used by people to make sweaters and other types of clothes.

What farm animals have skin?

Pigs have thick skin with a small amount of fur. Some pigs have more fur than others on their skin.

What covers your body?

The skin that covers your body is not like the skin that covers a pig. Your skin is soft with little hair on it.
