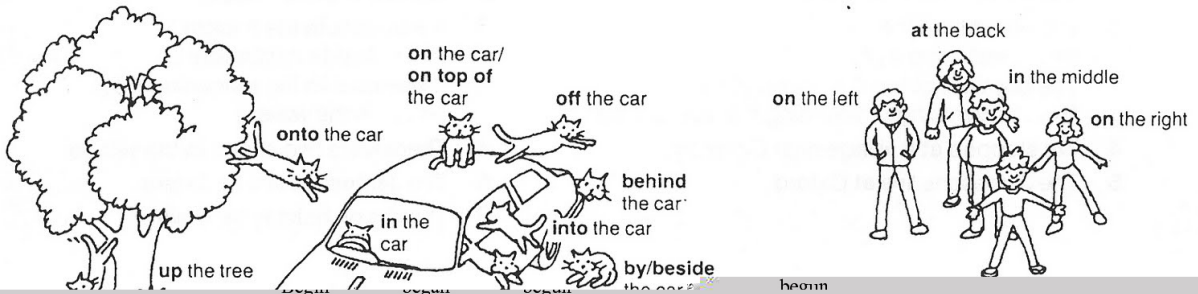


Prepositions

Prepositions of place and movement



<i>begin</i>	We <i>begin</i> class at 8:30am every day.	<i>Simple present tense</i>	<i>began</i>	We <i>began</i> class at 8:30am yesterday.	<i>Simple past tense</i>
<i>begin</i>	We <i>have just begun</i> class.	<i>Present perfect tense</i>	<i>begin</i>	We <i>begin</i> class at 9:30am tomorrow.	<i>Simple present tense</i>
<i>bent</i>	Maria <i>has bent</i> the straw many times.	<i>Present perfect tense</i>	<i>bent</i>	Maria <i>bent</i> the straw many times.	<i>Simple past tense</i>
<i>bite</i>	Some dogs <i>bite</i> people.	<i>Simple present tense</i>	<i>bite</i>	A dog <i>bite</i> a man yesterday.	<i>Simple past tense</i>
<i>bite</i>	Those snakes <i>have bitten</i> people a few times.	<i>Present perfect tense</i>	<i>bite</i>	Those snakes <i>bite</i> people.	<i>Simple present tense</i>
