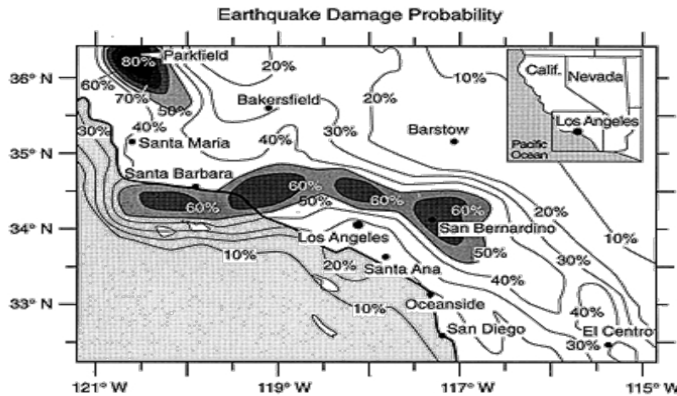


Base your answer to the questions 1 and 2 on the Earth Science Reference Tables, the map below, and your knowledge of Earth science.
