Books/Classics:

The Island (2009) (Isaac Asimov, Robert Ickovics PG 13 108 minutes)

A mysterious organization has created all the nice people, except for one fact now who live in a special facility because of winning the lottery to go to "The Island", where they will re-populate the Earth. One of the inhabitants gets suspicious when he discovers why they are there, and the situation gets things to turn out otherwise than seem.

The Giver (1993) (Lois Lowry PG 136 minutes)

Thomas Buelund is living the American dream. He has nice house and beautiful girlfriend in good score job. He lives in a quiet neighborhood and has good friends hanging out with his best friend, but he's terribly afraid of the past. One day, a girl tells him she's beyond. Thomas begins to wonder why he life is so perfect.

Moscow-1989 (1989) (Sergei Mamonov PG-13 [some sexually suggestive scenes] 120 minutes)

How could life be better than a 1989's Russia? Two teenagers find out when a magic remote-control device from science-fiction show, where Men has dinner on the table every evening and will tell him to worry about it who will take care of the house. Everything is in black and white. Sound familiar?
