

## Common Prepositions

Every sentence has to have a subject (a person or thing) and a verb (what that person or thing does.) But a really good sentence has more than just a simple subject and verb. Other kinds of words help make the sentence more exciting. A **preposition** can tell us more about **where** the subject is, and **when** the subject is doing something.



Many of the prepositions that we use a lot are prepositions that tell **where**. Others give us more information about the subject.
