

AUTHOR'S BIOGRAPHY

Roald Dahl wrote his first story in 1936. He won a British gold pencil for his story. In 1940 he joined the RAF and thereafter the subject of several of his first short stories, published in 1942. After that he became a very successful writer of short stories. He worked for the RAF, he visited the African continent in 1943 and in 1944 he started to write stories for his own children. His books are *Jarvis and the Giant Peach* and *The BFG*. He is now world famous and Dahl's occupation is one of the best jobs for children in the English language. His stories for adults are also very popular – and characterized by unexpected conclusions. Many of his books were translated into many languages in 1998.
