William Shakespeare



Born: 23 April 1564 - died: 23 April 1616

William Shakespeare was born in Stratford-upon-Avon in Warwickshire. He was baptised in the church of St Mary's Church, Stratford-upon-Avon, on 26 April 1564.

In his early school years he studied Latin, English, French and Italian. At the age of 14 he married a woman called Anne Hathaway, the daughter of a farmer. A year after they were married they had a daughter together and then had two sons in 1585. Very little is known about Shakespeare's activities from 1585 - 1592. During this period he went to London where he began a successful career as a playwright and actor. In his 20s and 30s he wrote his plays, his sonnets and many poems. Today, he is still popular with a wide range of audiences of all generations.

Shakespeare's most famous plays include *Hamlet*, *Macbeth*, *Romeo and Juliet* and *A Midsummer Night's Dream*.

Shakespeare retired to Stratford in the years before his death. He died on 23 April 1616 and was buried in the church of St Mary's Church, Stratford-upon-Avon.
