

### **Independent and Dependent Classes**

Following are some examples of classes. Underline main classes with one line and subordinate classes with two lines.

1. While the core teaching, research and scholarship, and service functions differ by institutional type, the campus life of every institution in the University System of Georgia will be characterized by a supportive campus climate.
2. Armstrong Atlantic State University offers a commitment to excellence and responsiveness within a scope of influence defined by the needs of an area of the state, and particularly outstanding programs or distinctive characteristics that have a major effect throughout the state.
3. Students enrolled in at least six hours at Savannah State University or at Armstrong Atlantic State University have the privilege of taking courses at the other university without paying an additional fee.
4. Students enrolled at Armstrong Atlantic State University who are pursuing business education may take more than half of their courses at Savannah State.
5. Transfer students are admitted for one semester. If they wish to remain at Armstrong Atlantic longer than one semester, they must submit a new letter of good standing or meet all transfer requirements for transfer students.
6. For fall semester 1999, applicants who pass the basic group of tests plus two additional SAT II subject tests will be eligible for admission to the university if all other freshman admission requirements are met.
7. The requirements for entry admission are the same as those listed for the joint enrollment program.
