Sentence typing—Simple, Compound, Complex

Simple Sentence = 1 Independent Clause

<u>Compound Sentence</u> = 2 or more Independent Clauses joined by either a comma/coordinating conjunction or a semi colon.

<u>Complex Sentence</u> = *At least* 1 Independent Clause AND *At least* 1 Subordinate Clause
