Mantle – special scroll cover Yad – 'hand', a pointer Rimmonim – bells to put on top scroll ends A 'Tree of Life' - teaches about how to live a goodly life.	
		Tenakh – What is it?	The Jewish Bible. Printed in the vernacular and includes the Torah. Christians call it the 'Hebrew Bible' or the 'Old Testament'. The Jewish Bible does <u>not</u> have the Jesus stories.	
		Stories of special people and events - Why are they important to Jews?	For example: Creation Joseph Moses Ruth Esther	Some stories tell of historical events. All illustrate good and poor behaviour, and teaching how we should, or should not, behave towards other people, animals and the environment. They may demonstrate qualities of, e.g. courage, bravery, leadership, wisdom, doing what is right and not following the crowd, etc.
	Family Life & Special Times	The Sabbath – How is it celebrated? Why is it kept?	Shabbat is the most important festival. Links to the story of Creation, Moses and the wandering in the desert, and the 10 Commandments. Friday evening meal – blessings over 2 candles, wine/grape juice, 2 challah loaves, followed by a proper dinner. A day of rest, family and friends. A day to reflect on the previous week.
