The Saint Report writing will be done in class. I will use this topic to teach how to write a short report. Students will be able to work on a presentation board for their saint at home. This involves buying a poster board, creating a title using the saint's name, and decorating the board with pictures or designs that provide information about the life of the saint. Student will be choosing a saint next week, and afterwards, I will send home more details about how to complete the poster board. This art project is meant to be a fun way to work together and learn more about a special saint of our church. The posters will not be due in class until after Thanksgiving. A packet about the Oral Book Talk will come home Wednesday. Students may begin choosing a book (*see note above) to read as nightly homework.</p>
