

Theme Lesson Plan

Essential Questions or Standardized Objectives:
<p>How will understanding the Theme in a story support your comprehension? Students will identify theme in a story and use evidence from the text to support it.</p> <p>ELA-RW.4 The student reads aloud, accurately (in the range of 90%), familiar material in a variety of genres, at the quality and complexity, in a way that makes meaning clear to listeners.</p>
<p>Activating Prior Knowledge/Background Knowledge:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The T will present a discussion by showing a short video and asking to the students to discuss other states known for tourism then reporting the states. T will then ask the students to identify words in the story that helped the students make their inferences. T will ask the students to give an example of what the students learned from the video that can be applied to their reading.
<p>Teaching Strategies/Engaging Organizers/Charting/After Reading: Guided Practice, and Processing: The students will predict what the story will be about. Guided Practice: Student will read the story and identify actions in the story that happened to match the reader's guess. Students will discuss on the Little League Chart. After Reading, I will ask comprehension questions to assess Comprehension, and have the students identify where they found the evidence that supports the theme of the book.</p>
<p>Assessing Strategies:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The students will discuss and organize the life that each team group. As a class we will mostly not debate on the teams.
<p>Follow-up Activities:</p> <p>Identify other themes from other stories and compare with the story we read in class.</p>
