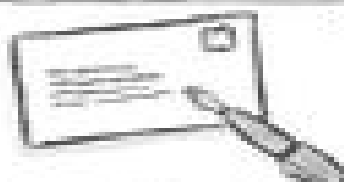




Letter of complaint

Dear Sir,

I am writing to complain about the state of the dump, known as Greenland Park, which can be seen from the front of my house.
