

Compound Sentences

A compound sentence is made up of two or more complete sentences.
(complete = independent = having both a subject and verb.)

She wanted to go, but she couldn't because she was sick.

Under each verb complete sentence in the first box by combining a complete main clause & a complete clause that cannot stand on its own. Use connecting words such as conjunctions. The two clauses must have their own

She went to the carnival.
She wanted to ride the roller coaster.
She played arcade games.
She tried to win a stuffed bear.
She started to get therapy.

She had a great time.
She rode on all the rides.
She didn't have enough money.
She didn't buy the bear.
She rode on a big bear.
I started to eat.
She was a really tall.
She bought a hot dog.

Example: She went to the carnival, but she didn't ride the bear.
