

Among the nine prepositional phrases of this sentence are two that take gerunds as their objects: of diagramming . . . and by attaching. . . . I would prefer, for consistency's sake, to place these two gerunds on pedestals; however, it has been done otherwise since the days of Reed and Kellogg, the great 19th-century propagators of this system of diagramming. Used and slanted are past participles. It is not uncommon for prepositional phrases to function as predicate adjectives.
