

The Infinitive

5g. An *infinitive* is a verb form that can be used as a noun, an adjective, or an adverb. Most infinitives begin with *to*.

- INFINITIVE USED AS NOUN** **To heal** was the athlete's first priority.
INFINITIVE USED AS ADJECTIVE The player **to watch** this season is Rodney.
INFINITIVE USED AS ADVERB This speech will be easy **to memorize**.
