If you come across a word you don't know, you can often understand it by breaking it into smaller pieces. "Decoding" the word by removing prefixes and suffixes until there is a root word that you know is a good way to improve your vocabulary.

The prefix ANTI means against, as in antibiotic

The prefix DIS means undo. anti dis establishment ari an

The suffix ARY means related to, as in revolutionary

The suffix IAN means belonging to, as in Canadian

The suffix ISM means ideology, as in communism are connected with being against undoing the establishment.

In the 1870s, the Church of England was the state church. Some people did not want it to be the state church. The people who felt it should remain the way it was (that is, they were against undoing the establishment) were called antidisestablishmentarians.
