Susan B. Anthony was a worker for women's rights. She was born in Massachusetts in 1820. She grew up at a time when women did not have the same rights as men. Women could not vote. They could not own property or hold certain jobs.

Susan B. Anthony worked hard to help women gain the same rights as men. She made speeches and wrote books. She formed and led a group that worked for women's right to vote. Slowly laws were changed to give women equal rights. Fourteen years after Susan B. Anthony's death, an amendment in honor of the woman who had worked all her life for the rights of women.
