

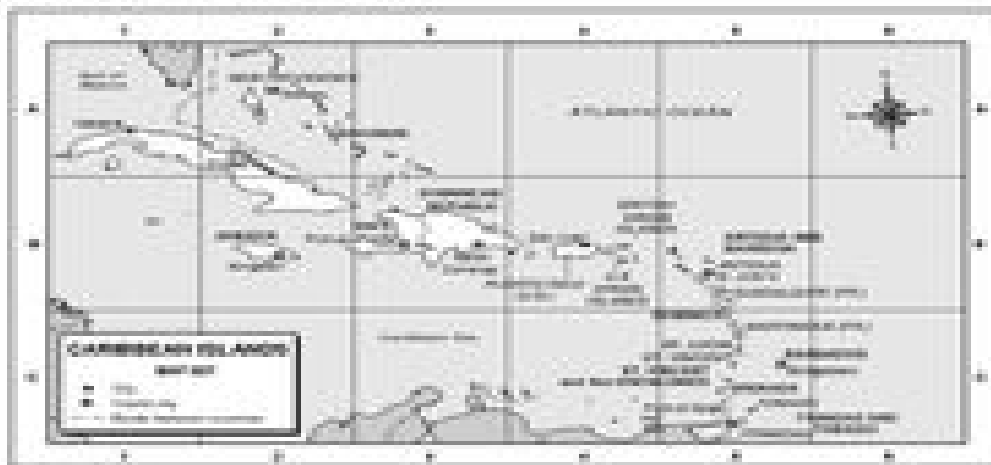

## Using a Map Grid

Some maps have a grid to help you to locate places. A map **grid** is a pattern of lines that cross each other. The lines form squares or rectangles. Each square or rectangle is a grid section. Each row of squares or rectangles has a letter. Each column of squares or rectangles has a number.

Look at the map of the Caribbean Islands. The letters are on the left and right sides. The numbers are on the top and bottom. Each rectangle on the map is marked with a letter and a number. Find grid section B-2 on the map. Put your finger on the letter B. Move your finger along the row. Stop when you get to column 2. What is in grid section B-2? Fatsaia and parts of other islands are in that section.
