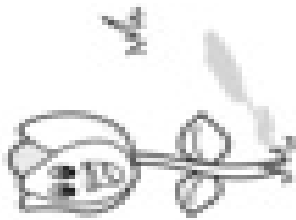


## Plenty of Plant Parts

A tulip and a carrot plant do not look alike. But they are a lot alike. In fact, all plants have the same three main parts. Each plant has roots, a stem, and leaves. Each of these parts has a job to do to help the plant live. The roots anchor the plant in the ground. They also take in water and minerals from the soil. The plant's stem holds up the plant. It also gives a way for water and minerals to travel from the roots to the leaves. The plant's leaves take in air and sunlight. They use the light and air, along with water and nutrients, to make the plant's food.

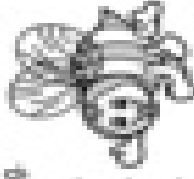
