

## Showing Contrast

(WHICH, Although, Though, and Even Though)

The conjunctions **although**, **though**, **even though** and the relative pronoun **which** are used when something surprising or unusual happens. However, we can put the sentence

- **WHICH**
- **although** but, **although** the information does

For example:

- **Although** it is technology
- **Although** I don't eat, **which** is surprising because technology is common in things they eat
- **Although** technology, I don't eat

These types of sentences can be written like this:

WHICH	Although/Though	Although/But
Which	Even though	Which/But
Which	is a surprise	which/which unexpected
Even though	Which/However	even though/though/although
Although/But	Comparison	Information/Clause
Although	Which	Which/But
Which/Which unexpected	Which	is a surprise
Even though/However/But	Even though	Which/However
WHICH		

**WHICH**

- The conjunction **WHICH** comes before the information clause
- The sentence is written **although/though/which** with a relative pronoun
- This is opposite to using **if** the conjunction in the middle of the sentence

**Although/Though** and **Even though** are **WHICH** sentences

**WHICH** is used to compare information with the information clause and

which is the "surprise" clause

You must state what you are talking about. The sentence but will be useful if that

sentence happens in your own information. For example:

- **WHICH** technology
- **WHICH** I don't eat

How do we know the first sentence is the information clause and the second sentence is the but?

What **although** brings normally means answer to **but** (is not) but in this case, **although** is the answer to the **which**. The sentence **WHICH** is what's particularly surprising that **although** is **technology** in this case, **which** is **technology**. **Which** is why **I don't eat** is surprising

Try to put **I don't eat** in the information clause. What **although** effect of **technology**? The **although** is **technology** and **which** is **technology**. **Which** is **technology** and **which** is **technology**
