- _____ 1. With an adult, develop a plan for someone to care for your pet if you were to be away for one week.
- _____ 2. Train your pet to do a trick or follow a simple command.
- _____ 3. Describe how your pet communicates with you and other animals.
- _____ 4. Observe or play with your pet for 15 minutes each day for one week. Keep a chart that shows your pet's mood on each day.
- _____ 5. Attend a pet show. Report to your den about the show.
- _____ 6. Make a drawing of the cage or bed your pet requires. Describe the important parts of it.
- _____ 7 Visit an animal shelter. Explain the reasons why pets are in the animal shelter to your den or family.
- _____ 8. Visit a pet store. Make a list of the different animals in the store and the kinds of foods they eat.
- _____ 9. Talk to a veterinarian about his or her career. Share what you learned with your den or family.
- _____ 10. Tell three ways that animals can help people.
- _____ 11 Do a service project for an animal shelter, exercise an elderly person's pet, or help a friend with the care of his or her pet.
