SENTENCE FRAGMENTS

SENTENCE FRAGMENTS ARE INCOMPLETE SENTENCES THAT HAVE BEEN PUNCTUATED AS IF THEY WERE COMPLETE THOUGHTS. COMPLETE SENTENCES MUST CONTAIN A SUBJECT AND A PREDICATE, AND MUST EXPRESS AN IDEA THAT CAN STAND ON ITS OWN.

*Example 1: According to Mrs. Owens, students are learning in this class.
This is a complete sentence.*

*Example 2: Dr. Thomas, who is the greatest math instructor.
This is a sentence fragment, because it does not contain a complete thought.*
