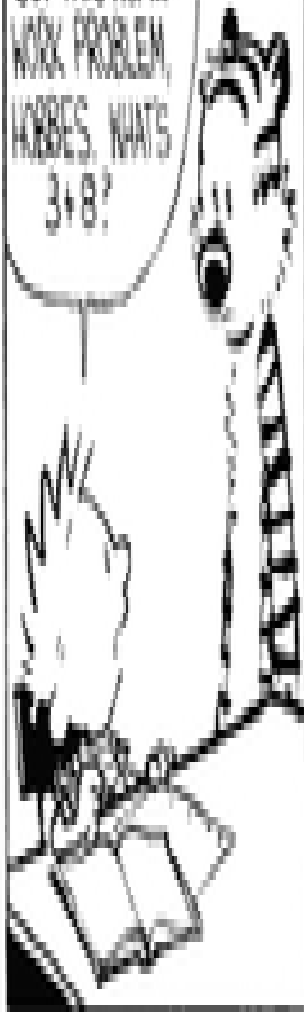


HELP ME FIGURE
