A Unit on Story Sequencing

Teacher: Laura Miller Grade: Kindergarten

Overview of the unit: The first day of the unit is very explicit and systematic in instruction. It includes the "meat" of the lesson, in which the students will learn to retell a story with the assistance of the teacher. Days two through five will provide the students with short, fifteen minute, independent practice sessions on storytelling. The final activity includes a flexible assessment in which the students will demonstrate an understanding of story sequence.
