common intransitive verb:

gehen go, kommen come, fallen whereabouts, reisen travel, sinken sink, steigen up, wachsen growth, bleiben stay, fehlen missing, helfen help, folgen to follow, denken want, warten to wait, passe appropriate

Vaterschnarcht (snore).

rdenkte an seinen Sohn.

certain intransitive verb, in certain circumstances can also be used as a transitive verb, dominated the fourth gabion language, such as:
