Conjunctions Worksheet (Identifying Part 2)

Conjunctions are words that join two or more words, phrases or clauses. Example Conjunctions; for, and, nor, but, or, yet, so.

Directions: Circle the conjunction that connects the two phrases. Then write **compound subject** or **compound predicate** to tell what parts the conjunction joins.
