The Old Operating Theatre, Museum and Herb Garret

Hidden in the roof of a church, a 300-year old herb garret houses Britain's only surviving 19th century operating theatre...

This museum, one of London's most intriguing historical interiors, contains: the $\ensuremath{\underline{\mathsf{Operating Theatre}}}$, which was used between 1821 and 1862 in the days before anaesthetic and antiseptic surgery; and

the <u>Herb Garret</u>, used by the apothecary of St Thomas's Hospital to store and cure herbs for medicines.

Museum collection

- Instruments for surgery, cupping, bleeding, trepanning and childbirth;
- · Devices used in the early days of anaesthesia and antisepsis;
- A skeleton, and pathological specimens;
- An extensive and aromatic display of dried herbs, fully labelled;
- Equipment for preparing pills and cachets, and storing medicines;
- A display on Florence Nightingale and the history of nursing;
 History of the Evelina Childrens' hospital, first established at Guy's.
