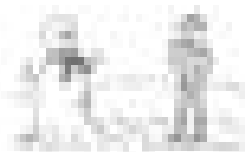
Material	Speed of sound (metres per second)

Whales in the ocean hear sounds more quickly than gulls do in a lake.

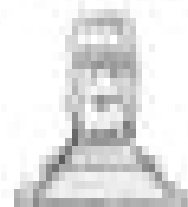


It is easier to hear sounds in winter than in summer.
