Susan B. Anthony was born in Massachusetts in 1820. A civil rights leader, she is best known for helping women win the right to vote in the United States. In 1872, Anthony was one of the first women ever to vote in a Presidential election in the United States. Though she did not live to see it pass, the 19th Amendment gave women the right to vote on August 18, 1920. She believed in equal rights for all people living in the United States, and she spoke out and worked against slavery.
