


































# DON'T MAKE IDOLS

*You shall not make for yourself an idol in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below. You shall not bow down to them or worship them.*  
 (Related scriptures: Exodus 20:4, Deuteronomy 5:8, Joshua 24:23-24)

In this code, each symbol stands for one of two letters. For example, \* sometimes stands for **B** and sometimes for **Y**. Use the code to decipher the names of things (idols) people sometimes focus their attention on, instead of worshiping God.
