## **Prepositions of Time**

## What is a preposition?

Prepositions are words that precede a noun or pronoun and express a relation between it and another word. A preposition of time can express when something happens at one point in time or when something happens over an extended period of time.

Prepositions Expressing One Point In Time		
Preposition	How It's Used	Examples
On	Used with days.	<ul> <li>We are meeting for lunch <i>on</i> Friday.</li> <li>The midterm is <i>on</i> Tuesday.</li> <li>Finals start <i>on</i> the 12th.</li> </ul>
At	Used with times of the day, including noon, midnight, and night.	<ul> <li>I will arrive at 7 p.m.</li> <li>Most animals sleep at night.</li> <li>I woke up at noon.</li> </ul>
In	Used with other parts of the day (not night, noon, or midnight), with months, with years, and with seasons.	<ul> <li>I brew coffee in the morning.</li> <li>He graduated in 2008.</li> <li>They got married in June.</li> <li>The roads get icy in winter.</li> </ul>

Prepositions Expressing Extended Time		
Preposition	How It's Used	Examples
Since	Expresses an action or state that was started and is still happening.	<ul> <li>He has been working on it since last year.</li> <li>She has lived here since 1988.</li> </ul>
For	Expresses the duration of an action or event.	<ul><li>I will be gone for a day.</li><li>She was sick for a week.</li></ul>
From & To/Until	Expresses the beginning and end of a period of time.	<ul> <li>I will be here from Monday to Friday.</li> <li>He lived in San Jose from 1995 to 2005.</li> <li>My office hours are from 12 p.m. to 3 p.m.</li> <li>The road is closed from March until June.</li> </ul>
During	Expresses a period of time over which an action occurs.	<ul><li>I read a book <i>during</i> my lunch break.</li><li>Owls sleep <i>during</i> the day.</li></ul>
Within	Used to show something will take place before a certain time.	<ul> <li>He will graduate within a year of entering the program. (No later than one year from his entry.)</li> <li>I will be there within 30 minutes.</li> </ul>
