


Intensity - Complementary Colors

sets of Complementary Colors In each set of squares paint a set of complementary colors starting with yellow and violet, yellow orange and ?, orange and ?, red orange and ?, red and ?, and in the last set paint red violet and ?.



Complementary Colors are directly across from each other on the color wheel. When complementary colors are placed side-by-side they neutralize the intensity of the color, this is great for depicting Examples: Yellow and Violet (purple), Blue and Orange, Red and Green. Intermediate colors also have a complementary fade intensity from top to bottom - heavy to light - Stay inside the edges of your box.

Yellow (pure hue)	Yellow + Yellow + Yellow + Violet	Yellow + Yellow + Violet	Yellow + Violet (equal proportions)	Violet + Violet + Yellow	Violet + Violet + Violet + Yellow	Violet (pure hue)

Red (pure hue)	Red + Red + Red + Green	Red + Red + Green	Red + Green (equal proportions)	Green + Green + Red	Green + Green + Green + Red	Green (pure hue)

Blue (pure hue)	Blue + Blue + Blue + Orange	Blue + Blue + Orange	Blue + Orange (equal proportions)	Orange + Orange + Blue	Orange + Orange + Orange + Blue	Orange (pure hue)
