## Homophones- To, Two, and Too

- Homophones are words that have the same sound as another word but have different spellings and meanings.
  - ✓ **To**- A preposition before a noun or infinitive before a verb.  
(Let's go to the store).
  - ✓ **Two**- The number 2 (I would like two tacos please.)
  - ✓ **Too**- A synonym for *also* or when having excess amounts.  
(There are too many people here.)
