Source #1 "I was likewise told by a Negro woman that as she was on her return home, one evening, from some neighbors... she was kidnapped; and, notwithstanding she was big with child, sold for a slave. This transaction happened a considerable way up the country; and she had passed through the hands of several purchasers before she reached the ship."

What does the author say about <u>how</u> slaves found themselves aboard a slave ship?



"The voyage itself took between 6 and 8 weeks. The enslaved Africans were chained together by the neck, hand and the foot, wearing sometimes the most uncomfortable and miserable gear. They were packed into the smallest places where there was barely enough room to lie on one's side. It was here that they ate, slept, urinated, defecated, gave birth, went insane and died. They had no idea where they were going or what was going to happen to them. Within these ships, Africans from different countries, regions, cultures and with different languages learned to communicate with each other, many conspired to overthrow their captors together."
