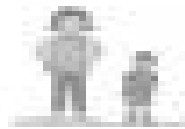

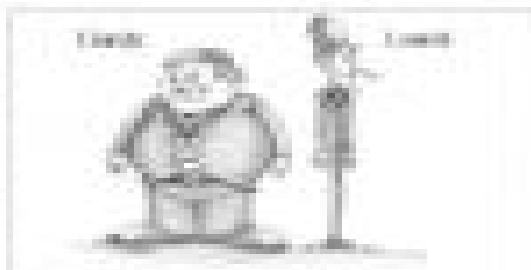
### COMPARATIVE AND SUPERLATIVE

**Superlative:** He is taller than Fred.  
**Comparative:** Fred is taller than John.  
**Equality:** Ann is as intelligent as Fred.



### EXERCISES

1. Look at the picture and complete the text with the comparative form of the adjectives.

ex. Peter — strong — Bob

ex. Michael — good — Sam

ex. John — difficult — Portuguese
