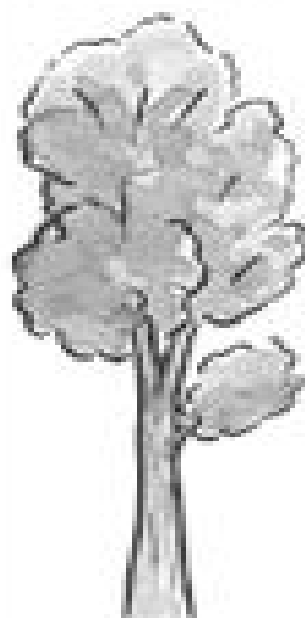




Patterns in poems
