Compare and Contrast: Setting

Compare and contrast helps you think about how two things are alike and different. We can **compare and contrast** different things in the stories we read. One thing we can compare and contrast is setting.

Example: A story about a middle school girl versus a story about a professional baseball player

One might be set in a middle school, or in a frilly girl's room. The other might be set on a baseball field or in a locker room.

Practice: Each item tells you about two characters and where they are. Compare and contrast the settings for the characters by imagining how they might be the same and different. List at least two ways these settings might be the same and two ways they might be different.

Example: Sarah is in the cafeteria at school. Lois is in gym class.

Same: noisy; lots of movement **Different:** eating vs. playing sports
